**ACCOUNT:** 005-09-5901-0004-48      **GRANT TITLE:** Building 21

**DESCRIPTION:**

The Allentown School District, in partnership with the non-profit school developer Building 21, will open a career-connected and early college District high school in the fall of 2015. The school will open with 150 9<sup>th</sup> graders, and will then add one grade per year to reach full enrollment capacity of 600 students in Year 4. All 8<sup>th</sup> grade students residing in Allentown School District are eligible to apply – students are selected through a lottery.

This project entails the extensive renovation of 265 Lehigh St., which will serve as the home for Building 21 Allentown. The renovations will enable the creation of cutting-edge 21<sup>st</sup> century learning spaces that allow for the extensive integration of technology into the classroom and the flexible grouping of students, while creating an environment conducive to applied and project-based learning.

**DESCRIPTION:**

The Carpenters JAC of Philadelphia and Vicinity is applying for RACP funding to continue its mission to provide first class quality vocational education to a new region of Pennsylvania. The Carpenters JAC is ready to make a commitment and investment to a full time Apprentice and Journeymen Training Center in Allentown, PA through a partnership with the City of Allentown and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The JAC has a plan for a State of the Art, 20,000 square foot training center. This facility will offer NEW career opportunities and training for all apprentices, journeymen and affiliate contractors in Lehigh Valley jurisdictional area.

**DESCRIPTION:** Community Bike Works offers a three-point approach to bicycle education: First, in broad-reaching bike safety assemblies, students learn about helmet use, hand signals, and rules of the road. Second, an in-depth Earn a Bike program allows students to learn bike mechanics and safety in a 12-week course. Upon program completion, students earn their bike and a new helmet. Finally, students are encouraged to participate in regular bike rides on Lehigh Valley trails.
